★ HB 124

- ★ Names the Fourth Thursday in March of each year "Tuskegee Airmen Day"
 - ★ Commemorates contributions made by Tuskegee Airmen in WWII
 - ★ Day of observation, but not a legal holiday

- **★** HB 697
 - ★ Creates the Mississippi Aviation Safety Act
 - ♣ Primary concern is registration and marking of "towers" on agricultural land greater than 50 but less than 200 feet in height
 - ★ Covers towers less than 10 feet in diameter at base (excluding any concrete or similar base), including meteorological evaluation towers, self-standing towers, real-time kinematic towers and towers supported by guy wires and ground anchors located on agricultural land
 - ★ Requires marking in accordance with the requirements specified in FAA AC 70/7460 IL
 - ★ Registration consists of <u>notification</u> to FAA or the Mississippi Agricultural Aviation Association

- ★ SB 2487
 - ↑ Increases payments to be made by the Department of Public Safety for any law enforcement or firefighter personnel that die in the performance of their duties
 - **★** \$150,000 basic benefit
 - \$25,000 for each minor child up to 4
 - ★ \$15,000 for funeral expenses

★ SB 2753


★ SAFER Act

★ Requires single sex or single user/family use restrooms and changing rooms in public facilities

★ SB 2762

★ Statute revises provisions relating to retainage to address private contracts and make technical changes with respect to public contracts by providing a definition of "retainage"
